RESOLUTION Mayor and Board of Aldermen City of Clinton Clinton, Mississippi

WHEREAS, Clinton is one of the fastest growing cities in the State of Mississippi and is recognized as one of the most progressive and forward looking communities in the state, and;

WHEREAS, the need is evident that a multipurpose facility that will accommodate the needs of young and old alike is urgently needed, and;

WHEREAS, this need is supported by action taken at a strategic planning retreat held in 1992 by the Clinton Chamber of Commerce indicating such a facility should be one of the top priorities that needed to be addressed, and;

WHEREAS, ninety-six percent (96%) of the respondents to a 1994 survey published in the *Clinton News*, a weekly newspaper servicing the Clinton area, indicated that the City was long overdue for a facility that could accommodate the performing and visual arts, a museum, and a place to hold community-wide meetings and conferences, and;

WHEREAS, such a facility was ranked among the six most critical issues facing the City following a study by Morrison & Associates prepared for the Economic Development Department of the City, and;

WHEREAS, in a letter dated July 1, 1999, from Entergy giving re-assessment recommendations for Clinton's renewal designation as a *Team City Mississippi*, it was pointed out that "there are no true tourist draws within Clinton" and indicating the community should "continue its efforts" for a multipurpose facility for its residents, and;

WHEREAS, on October 29, 1999, at its annual retreat and planning session, the Clinton Chamber of Commerce gave overwhelming support for such a facility, calling it "one of the real needs of the City of Clinton", and;

WHEREAS, the goal of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen has been to increase the tax base so that a greater burden will not be placed on the homeowners, and;

WHEREAS, a recent study commissioned by the Mississippi Arts Commission and conducted by ArtsMarket, Inc., of Bozeman, Mont., revealed that the non-profit arts had a \$55 million impact on the state, and;

WHEREAS, the study also disclosed that for every federal, state and local tax dollar allocated to the non-profit arts industry, the industry raised an additional \$3 through earned revenue and private donations, and;

WHEREAS, the ArtsMarket, Inc., study also shows that money spent in the community away from an arts engagement, such as hotel rooms and restaurants, totaled more than \$40 million, with \$16 million being contributed by out-of-state tourists, and;

WHEREAS, the complex proposed for Clinton will not only provide space for conferences, community meetings and banquets, and the performing and visual arts, but will also house the Mississippi Music Heritage Museum, which, alone, is expected to attract over 150,000 tourists annually, and;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, view this complex as a real need for the community and its residents, now; therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton do hereby endorse the Clinton Community Development Foundation, Inc., leadership in seeking to provide a Conference, Arts and Music Museum Complex for our growing City, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we give our unanimous support as elected public officials to the CCDF and its desire to see that such a complex is located in our community. Presented and passed this 18th day of April, the year 2000, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen duly assembled in regular session
