## Telephone Book Recycling Campaign

The 1997 telephone book deliveries are now underway in Clinton, and throughout the Metropolitan area. With the delivery of these books, the Clinton Beautification program, along with the City of Clinton are happy to announce the 1997 telephone book recycling campaign. The campaign will begin June 6 and continue until July 15.

### Did You Know ?

With the delivery of the new telephone books, over 15,000 used telephone books in the Clinton area will need disposal

These 15,000 used books weight approximately 85,000 pounds. This translates into 42 ½ tons of used telephone books in the Clinton area.

This 42 ½ tons of used telephone books would cover over 1 surface acre of costly landfill space

Throwing the used telephone books into your garbage translates into an additional tonage cost to the city of Clinton for the books to be picked up and placed in the landfill

Our telephone book recycling totals have grown steadily over the past four years. Last year the City of Clinton was recognized for its telephone book recycling efforts with over 7,000 books being turned in through the recycling bin

Our goal for 1997 is a minimum of 10,000 books.

Recycling the telephone books saves hundred of trees which would be used in the production of paper

Each telephone book is totally recyclable

The new telephone book is printed on recycled paper

Cities throughout the metropolitan area have joined efforts in a coordinated campaign to recycle over 500 tons of telephone books. Pick up bins will be located throughout the Hinds-Madison-Rankin county area

Indian Lanes Bowling Alley, for the fourth consecutive year, will be a supportive partner in our recycling campaign

Clinton's recycling bin will again be located at the north end of Indian Lanes near Northside Drive. This location provides easy drive up access for every Clinton citizen
