5. Dissecting these main traffic arteries, in an East/West alignment, is the Kansas City Southern Railroad line.

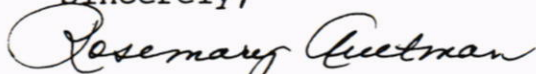

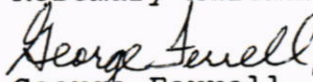

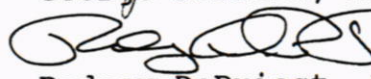
We believe this problem is not unsolvable. With some study and consideration we are confident that Kansas City Southern Railroad could make some minor adjustments in their train schedule through Clinton.

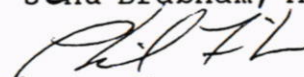

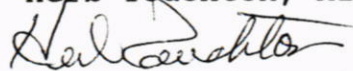
