APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS A-UU:

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and **SECONDED** by Alderman Touchton to approve Consent Agenda Items A-UU as listed on pages 242-243 of this Minute Book W, noting that Consent Agenda Items I, RR, SS, TT & UU, will serve to advertise favorably the opportunities, possibilities, and resources of the City of Clinton. DIMENSIONAL VARIANCE FOR 75' SIGN GRANTED TO DAYS INN

Attorney Bill Singletary on behalf of Mike Patel, owner of the Days Inn currently under construction on Springridge Road just north of I-20, requested the Board of Aldermen to consider overturning the Planning and Zoning Board's recommendation to deny that Dimensional Variance request for a 100' Days Inn Sign, and to grant said request for a 75-100' Days Inn Sign to attract Interstate Business, noting that Mr. Patel's property is right at the Interstate and will not effect any residential area. **MOTION** made by Alderman Brabham and **SECONDED** by Alderman Touchton to grant said variance for a 75' Days Inn Sign. **MOTION CARRIED 6-1** with Alderman Fisher casting the "nay" vote. SPECIAL EXCEPTION GRANTED TO PARKWAY BAPTIST CHURCH

Prior to discussion of the Special Exception request of Parkway Baptist Church, Alderman-at-Large Jehu Brabham excused himself from the Board Room and discussion at 7:28 p.m. due to his employment with Parkway Church as Administrator.

Acting upon the recommendation of the City of Clinton Planning and Zoning Board to approve that Special Exception request of Parkway Baptist Church to allow the construction of the new Parkway Baptist Church to locate their public quasi facility in the R-1 zone located on North Frontage Road west of Woodmoor Subdivision, **MOTION** made by Alderman Touchton and **SECONDED** by Alderman Lott to accept the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Board and approve said special exception. **MOTION CARRIED 6-0**. Alderman Brabham not present for voting. Proof of Publication of proper public hearing may be found on page 246 of this Minute Book W.

CONCEPT OF UTILITY COST ANALYSIS SERVICES APPROVED SUBJECT TO DETAILED REVIEW OF CONTRACT

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and **SECONDED** by Alderman DePriest to approve the concept of the agreement proposed by Utility Analysts, Inc., as shown on pages 247-248 of this Minute Book W to study the City power, gas, and telephone bills in an effort to reduce the monthly utility charges subject to a detailed review of proposed contract by the City Attorney. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING 13TH PAYCHECK TO POLICE & FIRE DISABILITY & RELIEF FUND RETIREES FOR 1993-1994

MOTION made by Alderman Todd and **SECONDED** by Alderman Touchton to adopt that Resolution found on pages 249-250 of this Minute Book W authorizing the 13th paycheck to the police & fire disability & relief fund retirees for 1993-1994. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**. It was noted that this resolution must be adopted annually, and employees need to understand that the 13th paycheck is an optional "extra" bonus check which may or may not be granted each year.

WICKSTEAD ROAD SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION ADOPTED AND PUBLIC HEARING DATE SET

PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD TO RE-CONSIDER SIGNAGE RULES FOR INTERSTATE PROPERTY

MOTION made by Alderman Todd and SECONDED by Alderman Touchton requesting the City of Clinton Planning and Zoning Board to re-consider the interstate access to Clinton regarding the signage rules and regulations on land being immediately adjacent to the interstate and on land just off the interstate and terrain elevations and make a recommendation back to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as to whether the height restrictions, etc., might need to be changed for property abutting the interstate. COTTON ACRES SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION TO BE PRESENTED TO BOARD AT NEXT MEETING

Mayor Aultman stated that the Cotton Acres Special Assessment Resolution establishing the "not greater than 6% interest rate" which was left out of the original Special Assessment Resolution as adopted on June 1, 1993, and found on page 1146-1148 of Minute Book V shall be presented at the next Board Meeting for consideration and adoption. Said assessments shall begin with 1994 taxes.

TEMPORARY SHELTER TO BE LOOKED INTO FOR USE WHILE VERNON ROAD BRIDGE IS BEING REPAIRED

With notice that Vernon Road is now closed for approximately 30 days for bridge repair, Alderman Brabham reminded the Board that the City is to be looking into providing a temporary "bus stop" type shelter for school children to be using during inclement weather until such time the bridge is repaired and children can wait at their residences as normal.

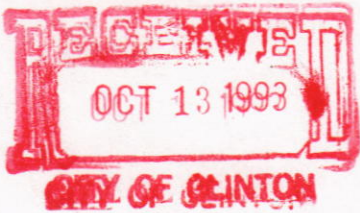

"SHARED-SAVINGS" AGREEMENT
FOR
UTILITY COST ANALYSIS SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into as of this 2nd day of Nov., 1993 by and between City of Clinton, Mississippi, (hereinafter referred to as OWNER), and Utility Analysts Inc., of Jackson, MS, (hereinafter referred to as ANALYST).

INTENT OF AGREEMENT

OWNER wishes ANALYST to audit the utility billings for a period of one (1) year, and to continue thereafter until cancelled by thirty (30) days written notice by either party. OWNER will promptly submit his utility bills and any additional information that pertains to OWNER's utility billings on a monthly basis during this period.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

1. The analysis shall cover electricity, natural gas, and telecommunications.
2. ANALYST will make a detailed study of all factors affecting OWNER's costs and will submit recommendations for all possible savings and refunds that can be obtained.
3. OWNER will provide ANALYST with a letter of authorization to receive OWNER's past billing history. OWNER will forward to ANALYST, OWNER's utilities billing for each audited location on a monthly basis.
4. All recommendations made by ANALYST will be submitted in writing and will be subject to OWNER's approval. When a recommendation is then acted upon by OWNER, it will be deemed as accepted. If implemented, any savings will be shared as listed below.
5. OWNER will forward to ANALYST a copy of all correspondence between the OWNER and his utility suppliers, and any replies from these suppliers involving the recommendations.
6. OWNER agrees to pay ANALYST as follows:
 - (1.) There will be no retainer fee required. This will cover all present and future facility locations.
 - (2.) OWNER agrees to pay ANALYST fifty percent (50%) of each earned refund from errors or overcharges as they appear on OWNER's billing.

(3.) OWNER agrees to pay ANALYST fifty percent (50%) of each utility savings secured for a period of thirty-six (36) months, payable only after OWNER has received his monthly computation of savings.

(4.) In the event that an earned refund is still pending, or a savings is in effect at the expiration of this agreement, OWNER will continue payments until the agreement is fulfilled.

(5.) ANALYST agrees to pay OWNER fifty percent (50%) of each cost that OWNER incurs as a result of implementing any utility cost savings measure that ANALYST recommends. The intent of this section, is to assure that all utility cost savings resulting from this contract will be net to OWNER.

7. OWNER agrees that should ANALYST determine an error or savings at any one metered location of OWNER's facilities, that ANALYST will be given the right to determine that similar error or savings at any other of OWNER's facilities covered under this agreement.
8. Any errors or overcharges or rate changes OWNER develops prior to receiving ANALYST's written recommendation, will not have to be shared with ANALYST. A grace period of thirty days from the utility bill date will be recognized to determine OWNER identified savings.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on October 16, 1990, a Resolution was adopted by the City of Clinton requesting the Mississippi Legislature to enact legislation to authorize the City of Clinton to establish the payment of one (1) additional payment per year from the monies accumulated in the Clinton Police and Fire Disability and Relief Fund to be paid directly to retired members of said fund, or the beneficiaries thereof, who on December 1 of each year are receiving a retirement allowance under Section 21-29-139 of the Mississippi Code of 1972. The amount shall be equal to the annual percentage change in each fiscal year of the consumer price index set by the United States government, not to exceed two and one-half percent (2 1/2%) of the annual retirement of the allowance, for each full fiscal year that the retired member or beneficiary has actually drawn retirement payments from the date of retirement or the passage of this Act, whichever is the later date. The first additional payment as described herein will, however, be payable to recipients as of December 1, 1991, who were recipients as of June 30, 1991; and;

WHEREAS, the Senate approved such request in the form of House Bill No. 751, approved by the Governor on April 9, 1991, authorizing the governing authorities of the City of Clinton to establish the payment of an additional payment each year to retired members of the Clinton Police and Fire Disability and Relief Fund based on the change in the consumer price index; to provide that payment of the additional payments shall not be established unless the disability and relief fund currently is actuarially sound and will remain actuarially sound if the additional payments are made; and for related purposes; and

WHEREAS, the governing authorities wish to establish the additional payments authorized in House Bill No. 1712, as amended, by House Bill No. 751, and request the Board of Trustees of the Public Employees' Retirement System to make payments directly to the persons authorized and entitled to receive the payments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, that the City is hereby authorized to establish the payment of one (1) additional payment each year from monies accumulated in the Clinton Police and Fire Disability and Relief Fund to retired members of such disability and relief fund or beneficiaries thereof who on December 1 of each year are receiving a retirement allowance under Section 21-29-139, Mississippi Code of 1972. The amount of such payment shall be equal to the annual percentage change in each fiscal year of the consumer price index set by the United States government, not to exceed two and one-half percent (2 1/2%) of the annual retirement allowance for each full fiscal year after June 30, 1990, that the retired member or beneficiary has actually drawn retirement payments from the date of retirement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governing authorities of the City of Clinton hereby request the Board of Trustees of the Public Employees' Retirement System to make payments directly to the persons authorized and entitled to receive the payments in accordance with Section 3 of House Bill No. 751.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, acting as the governing authority of said municipality, determined that certain special improvements, namely, sanitary sewer facilities, should be provided and located in the Wickstead Special Improvement District; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 1993, a Resolution authorizing that project and the assessment of its cost against the property benefit was approved by the governing authority; and

WHEREAS, the project has been completed at a total cost of Sixty-Two Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$62,126.30) which includes construction costs of \$57,143.80 and engineering costs of \$4,982.50; and

WHEREAS, the construction cost of said project less the City of Clinton's portion is to be assessed equally among the properties benefitted by the project, a list of which is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has caused to be prepared an assessment book for local improvements into which has been placed the assessments for the special improvements of the Wickstead Special Improvement District; and

WHEREAS, the assessment roll, including the identity of the properties assessed and the amounts assessed against each property, is now available for inspection in the office of the City Clerk during regular business hours;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDAINED as follows:

1. The cost of construction (less the City of Clinton's portion which consists of boring under the railroad and providing for an associated pump in the amount of \$ 5,116.00) of Fifty-Two Thousand Twenty-Seven Dollars and Eighty Cents (\$52,027.80) is hereby assessed against the property benefitted by the special improvements constructed in the Wickstead Special Improvement District and the individual properties listed on Exhibit A are hereby assessed the sum of \$ 3,716.27 each plus interest at the rate of ^{NOT GREATER THAN} 6 7/8 annually on the unpaid balance with the first installment of the assessment being due on February 1, 1995.

2. Notification should be given in writing to each of the property owners of the hearing set by this Resolution to hear objections to said assessment.

3. The Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby set a hearing for 7 P. M., December 7, 1993, at its regular Board meeting in the Courtroom of the City of Clinton to hear objections to said assessments.

4. The City Clerk is directed to advertise in some newspaper published in said municipality, the first notice of which shall be published not less than fifteen (15) days from the date of the hearing.
