**DEPOSITORY BIDS OPENED AND TAKEN UNDER ADVISEMENT**

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 304 of this Minute Book W that sealed bids would be received for the privilege of keeping City funds for fiscal years 1993-94-95, bids were received and opened from Magnolia Federal Bank, Bank of Mississippi, Trustmark National Bank, and Deposit Guaranty National Bank. The public was offered an opportunity to examine said bids. The Mayor then stated that said bids would be taken under advisement and awarded at the next board meeting. Copies of said bids are on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

**CONSIDERATION OF WRECKER SERVICE ORDINANCE AMENDMENT POSTPONED FOR FURTHER REPORT FROM POLICE CHIEF**

A meeting having been set for Thursday, January 6, 1994, 10 a.m., with the Chief of Police and the four Clinton business owners who operate wrecker service for the City non-preference rotation calls for the purpose of gathering additional data, discussion of possible amendment to the current City wrecker service ordinance has been postponed until Police Chief Byington brings a report of said meeting and his recommendation back to the Board of Aldermen. **NO BOARD ACTION** taken.

**RIVERWOOD INTERNATIONAL REQUEST FOR LIEN WAIVER AUTHORIZED**

**MOTION** made by Alderman Touchton and **SECONDED** by Alderman Fisher to approve that lien waiver found on pages 305-306 of this Minute Book W allowing BOT Financial Corporation to take first lien position on the two pieces of equipment itemized in said lien waiver. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

**NO BOARD ACTION TAKEN ON COMMUNITY FACILITIES PLAN**

Mr. Larry Smith of CMPDD having submitted a proposal for the preparation of the fourth and final element of the City of Clinton's comprehensive plan, namely the Community Facilities Plan, noting that this requirement must be completed prior to public hearings being held for the new zoning ordinance, said proposal was taken under advisement for the Board of Aldermen to begin looking for ways to address this requirement since no monies had been budgeted this year to develop the Community Facilities Plan. **NO BOARD ACTION** taken at this time.

**AD HOC COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO BRING FORTH NEW CONTRACT FOR CONCESSION RIGHTS IN THE PARKS & RECREATION PROGRAM**

An ad hoc committee comprised of Aldermen Brabham, Fisher, and Touchton; Parks and Recreation Director Arledge; two members of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee yet to be confirmed; and the Presidents of the Baseball/Softball and Soccer Associations who will be representative of their respective groups, was appointed to bring forth a new contract for concession rights in the Parks & Recreation Program.

Responsibilities to be included are (1) the development of a contract between the City of Clinton and the Baseball/Softball and Soccer Associations authorizing said associations to operate the concession stands in the City Parks for the proceeds with a small portion of said proceeds being returned to the City's general parks & recreation program; (2) to develop a financial statement from said associations; an audit process with the City Comptroller helping determine some of the controls that should be in place for audit purposes; and in general to develop guidelines that will allow the Associations to operate more efficiently; (3) in order to utilize both Coke and Pepsi in the Parks and Recreation Program, new bid specifications must be developed asking Coke and Pepsi to bid separately for the privilege of Baseball/Softball concession rights and for Soccer concession rights. The results of these bids will determine whether Coke will service Baseball/Softball or Soccer; and the same for Pepsi.

Said Ad Hoc Committee Report and recommendation to be presented to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen at the February 15, 1994, meeting of the Board. **NO BOARD ACTION.**

**MAYOR AULTMAN NAMED AS PROJECT REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE BRIARS WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY PROJECT**

Having been authorized at the December 7, 1993, Meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as shown on page 263 of this Minute Book W to proceed with geo-technical studies at the Southwest, Southeast, Northeast, and Industrial Park Treatment Plants, City Engineer Broome apprised the Board that the cost estimate submitted by Burns Cooley Dennis, Inc., is in the amount of \$21,198.00 as found on pages 308-312 of this Minute Book W. **NO BOARD ACTION** required.

**CONSENT AND WAIVER BY LANDLORD  
OF REAL ESTATE**

WHEREAS, the undersigned, CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI, is the Landlord of real estate located in Hinds County, Mississippi and being more particularly described as follows:

A parcel of land situated in the Northwest Quarter (NW 1/4) of Section 19, Township 6 North, Range 1 West in Hinds County, Mississippi, particularly described as beginning at a point 773 feet South of the Northwest corner of the NW 1/4 of Section 19, Township 6 North, Range 1 West, run thence East 769.6 feet to a point; thence South 17 degrees 02 minutes west 469.8 feet to a point; thence South 325.75 feet to a point; thence west 632 feet to a point; thence North 774.95 feet to the point of beginning containing 12 acres, more or less.

(hereinafter referred to as the "Premises"), all or a portion of which Premises are now or are to be occupied by Riverwood International USA, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Lessee"); and

WHEREAS, Lessee has leased or will lease from BOT FINANCIAL CORPORATION, (hereinafter referred to as "Lessor") under or pursuant to an Equipment Leasing Agreement dated as of December 10, 1993, between Lessee and Lessor (hereinafter referred to as the "Lease") the following equipment (hereinafter referred to as the "Equipment"):

One (1) new Man Roland Cartoman I variable size web offset press and one (1) new Zerand-Bernal platen cutter creaser.

NOW THEREFORE, for valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the undersigned, the undersigned does hereby agree and waive as follows:

The undersigned waives and disclaims each and every right which the undersigned now has or may hereafter have under the laws of the State of Missouri or any other state or by or under the terms of any lease, mortgage or other agreement now or hereafter in effect, to levy or distrain upon the Equipment for rent (whether in arrears or in advance or both) or to claim or assert any lien, right, title or interest in or to the Equipment.

3. The undersigned agrees and acknowledges that any right, title or interest which Lessor now has or may hereafter have in or to the Equipment and by or under the Lease is superior to any claim, lien, right, title or interest of any nature which the Undersigned now has or may hereafter have against or with respect to the Equipment by or under any law or any lease, mortgage or other agreement or otherwise.

4. The undersigned agrees that Lessor or its agents may enter the Premises and remove all or any portion of the Equipment therefrom at any time that Lessor is entitled so to do under the terms of the Lease or otherwise, without liability or accountability to the undersigned therefore; and the undersigned hereby irrevocably grants to Lessor and its agents the right of entry to the Premises to remove the Equipment, or any portion thereof, from the Premises at any reasonable time or times.

Gentlemen:

We are pleased to submit this proposal for conducting geotechnical stability investigations for the referenced wastewater treatment facilities. This proposal was requested by Mr. Richard Broom on December 16, 1993.

The referenced facilities have been constructed or significantly modified within the past four years. Modifications and new construction have included the addition of Biolac structures and lagoons, deepening of existing lagoons, and the addition of sand filters. Slope failures have occurred at three of the referenced sites. The occurrence of these slope failures and failure of the Biolac structure at the Lovett treatment facility have generated concerns regarding the stability of other features which have performed satisfactorily to date. In addition, plans for remediation of existing slope failures are required.

It is our understanding that geotechnical investigations have not been performed at the referenced facilities. The purposes of the stability investigations will be:

- 1) to explore subsurface soil conditions at the referenced sites by means of a limited number of soil borings;
- 2) to evaluate pertinent physical properties of the soils encountered in the borings by means of laboratory testing; and

3) after evaluation of the soil boring and laboratory test data, to investigate the future stability of the slopes and structures, to provide recommendations for modifications if instabilities are anticipated, and to provide recommendations for repair of existing slope failures.

The facility modifications and construction to be considered in this investigation have been completed for approximately 1.5 years to 4 years. Considering the observed performance of the constructed items to date, it can be concluded that adequate factors of safety existed for the end-of-construction, or short-term, undrained loading condition. Based on the time interval between completion of construction and failure of the slopes, and considering visual observations of the failed slopes, it is our opinion that the slope failures occurred under long-term, drained loading conditions. Visual observations at the sites also indicate the presence of high plasticity clays (CH) at some locations. High plasticity clays generally exhibit relatively low drained strengths and are susceptible to significant reductions in strength resulting from straining and/or weathering. Evaluation of stability under long-term drained conditions also requires an accurate characterization of groundwater levels and corresponding piezometric pressures. The sensitivity of the drained strength of high plasticity clays (CH) to weathering and strain, and the difficulties associated with predicting variations in piezometric levels result in a lower level of confidence in estimated factors of safety for slopes which include high plasticity clays. However, upper and lower bound factors of safety can generally be determined with a reasonable level of confidence.

We propose to explore subsurface soil conditions at the referenced sites by means of 11 soil borings. Borings made for the evaluation of the stability of the Biolac structures and slopes would extend to exploration depths of 40 ft and 30 ft, respectively. Borings for evaluating the stability of the sand filter slopes at the SE WWTF would extend to a completion depth of 20 ft. Relatively undisturbed samples of the soils encountered in the borings would be obtained at 3-ft to 5-ft intervals of depth by pushing a 3-in. OD thin-wall Shelby tube sampler 2-ft into the soil. Disturbed samples of coarse-grained soils would be obtained by driving a standard split-spoon sampler 18-in. into the soil using a 140-lb hammer falling 30 in. All soils encountered during drilling would be examined and classified in the field by a geotechnical engineering technician. The samples recovered from the borings would be appropriately packaged for transport to our laboratory. The 30-ft and 40-ft deep boreholes would be filled from bottom-to-top with pumped-in cement-bentonite grout after completion of drilling and sampling. The 20-ft boreholes would be backfilled with soil cuttings.

Tests would be performed in the laboratory on selected representative samples from the borings to investigate the strengths, classifications and volume change properties of the soils encountered. Unconfined compression tests would be performed to evaluate the undrained shear strength characteristics of fine-grained clayey soils. Direct shear tests would be performed on high plasticity clays (CH) to evaluate the peak and residual drained strengths parameters. Atterberg limit tests would be conducted to investigate classifications and volume change properties of fine-grained soils and to extend the usefulness of the strength test data.

**BURNS COOLEY DENNIS, INC.**

Analyses would be performed to investigate the cause and appropriate remedial measures for the failed slopes. Analyses would also be conducted to evaluate the future performance of the Biolac structures and slopes. An engineering report would be prepared for each site including our findings, results of analyses performed and recommendations for repair of the failed slopes. Each report would include a plan showing the boring locations, graphical logs of the borings, the results of all laboratory tests, the results of the analyses, a description of the work performed and our recommendations.

We would perform the scope of work outlined in the preceding paragraphs for an estimated sum of \$21,198.00. If during this investigation it is determined that additional soil borings are required, the additional drilling and sampling would be billed at our standard unit rate of \$13.50 per ft. We would not exceed the estimated cost without prior approval from the City of Clinton. The estimated price does not include any special consultation services beyond those required to clarify the recommendations presented in the reports. Our worksheet utilized in developing this cost estimate is included as an attachment to this proposal.

For purposes of developing the cost estimate for this proposal, we have assumed that site survey data (i.e., cross sections of slopes, structure geometry, etc.) would be provided by others. We have also assumed that there would not be any inordinate time delays for the field crew related to the location and avoidance of underground utilities.
