AGENDA CHANGES

Mayor Aultman announced that an update from the attorneys on pending litigation will be added under Other Business and that an Executive Session would be asked for at the proper time to discuss said litigation matters.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS A-AA:

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Fisher to approve Consent Agenda Items A-AA as listed on page 376 of this Minute Book W, noting that Consent Agenda Items B and C, will serve to advertise favorably the opportunities, possibilities, and resources of the City of Clinton. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

AUTHORIZATION GRANTED TO ABANDON EASEMENT IN CASCADES SUBDIVISION FOR SUSANN CORPORATION

As noted at the February 1, 1994, meeting, that there are no existing utilities in that portion of easement requested to be abandoned and no foreseeable need for said easement, and having received the necessary written petition requesting said abandonment which is on file in the Office of the City Attorney, **MOTION** made by Alderman Touchton and **SECONDED** by Alderman Fisher to adopt that ordinance found on pages 378-381 of this Minute Book W and on pages 567-570 of the City of Clinton Ordinance Book II, releasing and vacating said easement on Lot 29, Cascades Subdivision, Part 6A. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Proofs of Publication may be found on page 382 of this Minute Book W and on Page 571 of the City of Clinton Ordinance Book II. Copy of Quitclaim Deed and Disclaimer may be found on pages 383-385 of this Minute Book W.

PERMISSION GRANTED TO ADVERTISE FOR PARKS & RECREATION BIDS

MOTION made by Alderman Brabham and **SECONDED** by Alderman Todd to grant permission to advertise for bids for renovation of adult

softball fields #1 and #2. Prior to a vote being taken, Alderman Touchton requested the motion be amended to read that bids be advertised for lights with bids quoting prices for fencing in both a 5' and 6' height. More discussion followed in which it was noted that the pressboxes will be built by the Clinton High School Vo-Tech, and the previous motion was WITHDRAWN.

MOTION then made by Alderman Brabham and SECONDED by Alderman Touchton to grant authorization to the Parks and Recreation Director to proceed to advertise for bids for both 5' and 6' fencing and for the lighting package as published in the aldermen's packets and on file in the Office of the City Clerk, and to return such information to the Board at the nearest date possible in the future. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

NORTHSIDE PARK BUDGET AMENDED

Parks and Recreation Director Arledge requested the Board to amend the Northside Park Budget by \$2,475.00, from \$100,000.00 to \$102,475.00 (\$675.00 for red sand and \$1,800.00 to the contractor), noting that this addition will allow enough funds to cover the playground equipment purchase, the completion of sidewalk juncture, and the necessary funds to excavate poor soils. Arledge stated that the Traceway Park Fitness Trail Budget could be reduced from \$15,000.00 to \$12,000.00 to allow for the difference needed at Northside Park. MOTION made by Alderman Brabham and SECONDED by Alderman Ferrell to amend the Northside Park Budget from \$100,000.00 to \$102,475.00. ROLL CALL VOTE: Alderman Brabham - "aye", Alderman Ferrell - "aye", Alderman DePriest - "nay", Alderman Todd - "aye", Alderman Fisher - "aye", Alderman Touchton - "aye", Alderman Lott - "aye". MOTION CARRIED 6-1.

Mayor Aultman then appointed Aldermen Brabham, Touchton, and Todd to serve on a committee to work with the Parks & Recreation Director to work out a funding formula for the purchase of the proposed canopy/pavilion for Northside Park on the premise that if enough money can't be found to fund the project in its entirety this year that at least enough monies be found to transport and store said canopy until next year when monies can be budgeted to complete project. Said committee to bring a report back to the March 1, 1994, Board Meeting.

AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND ROADSIDE SAFETY PROJECT GRANT (SIGNAGE STUDY)

Acting upon the request of the Office of Highway Safety to revise the Roadside Safety Project Budget to reflect the actual \$48,968.00 amount the State will apply towards said project in lieu of the earlier requested amount of \$53,509.60, noting the City's portion will be \$18,793.85 with a total project cost of \$67,761.85, MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to amend said grant out of the Street Budget. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Copy of subgrant signature sheet and summary cost sheets may be found on pages 386-388 of this Minute Book W.

AUTHORIZATION TO RETAIN AUDITOR

Noting that at the July 6, 1993, meeting, the City had previously voted to retain a new auditor beginning October 1, 1993, but that since that time, the City has hired a new comptroller and feels that it is in the best interest of the City to remain with auditors who are already familiar with the City records to keep continuity and allow the new auditor to begin after the 9-30-94 fiscal year. MOTION made by Alderman Todd and SECONDED by Alderman Depriest to retain Tann, Brown & Russ Co., Ltd., as auditors through fiscal year ending 9-30-94 and performing audit for said year. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

EXECUTIVE SESSION - 7:55 P.M.

Upon the request of Mayor Aultman to consider Executive Session for the purpose of hearing a preliminary report from Williford, Gearhart & Knight regarding sewer facilities and other matters of pending litigation not related to wastewater, MOTION made by Alderman Brabham and SECONDED by Alderman Ferrell to consider entering Executive Session for the stated purpose. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Prior to going into Executive Session, Mayor Aultman asked if there were any other comments that needed to be made or any "Other Business" items that needed to be discussed, and receiving none, MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and SECONDED by Alderman Touchton to enter Executive Session for the stated purpose. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Present for Executive Session were Mayor Aultman; Aldermen Brabham, Ferrell, DePriest, Todd, Fisher, Touchton, and Lott; Attorneys Carolyn Mills and Ken Dreher; Public Works Director Alderman; City Engineer Broome; Engineer Greg Gearhart; and David Dennis and Eddie Templeton of Burns, Cooley, & Dennis Engineers. After completion of discussion regarding the wastewater situation, those persons not involved in other litigation matters left the room at 8:58 p.m.

Present for the remaining Executive Session period were Mayor Aultman; Aldermen Brabham, Ferrell, DePriest, Todd, Fisher, Touchton, and Lott; Attorneys Mills and Dreher; and Police Chief Byington. Following completion of discussion of litigation matter, Harold Burns vs. Wayne Brown and others, MOTION made by Alderman Todd and SECONDED by Alderman Fisher to exit Executive Session at 9:18 p.m. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ATTORNEY TO FILE DOCUMENTS RELATIVE TO BURNS VS. BROWN AND OTHERS

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to authorize the City Attorney to file the necessary legal documents as they pertain to the above-stated case on behalf of Wayne Brown. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

WHEREAS, SusAnn Corporation has petitioned the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, in writing, to close and vacate a certain easement on Lot 29, Cascades Subdivision, Part 6A, more particularly described herein; and

WHEREAS, such petitioner is the owner of all of the property abutting on the aforesaid easement and the only person affected by the closing and vacating thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen do hereby expressly find, adjudicate, and determine that such easement, as now platted, is not used for municipal utilities and that the public convenience and necessity does not require the use thereof; and that the formal closing and vacating of the same will not impair the value of the abutting property nor in any wise affect the use, occupancy, or enjoyment thereof and that it is in the best interest of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, that such easement be closed and vacated.
