WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Rosemary Aultman extended a special welcome to members of the Brighton Homeowners Association. Mayor Aultman announced that having completed the first construction phase of Northside Park, said park was officially dedicated at 6 p.m. today.

APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS A-X:

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Lott to approve Consent Agenda Items A-X as listed on page 655-656 of this Minute Book W, noting that Consent Agenda Items B, C, and D, will serve to advertise favorably the opportunities, possibilities, and resources of the City of Clinton. Quotes listed in items Q and X are on file in the Office of the City Clerk. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION OF 1994-1995 MOTOR VEHICLE ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 657 of this Minute Book W that a public hearing would be held for the purpose of hearing any objection or protest to the 1994-1995 Motor Vehicle Assessment Schedule as prepared by the Mississippi State Tax Commission to be used in assessing, calculating and collecting ad valorem taxes on motor vehicles within the City of Clinton and the Clinton Public School District for taxable year 1994-1995, Mayor Aultman opened the public hearing and requested that since no petitions or questions had been received that said schedule be accepted as published. **MOTION** made by Alderman Touchton and **SECONDED** by Alderman Lott to accept the 1994-1995 Motor Vehicle Assessment Schedule as presented. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Copy of said Assessment Schedule is on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

PUBLIC HEARINGS ON UNCLEAN LOTS AS SPECIFIED

Public Works Director Harold Alderman reported that proper notices had been mailed to the property owners listed in agenda item 8 A-M with return receipts received from all but Milton and Chandra Magee as listed in agenda item 8-M. Mr. Alderman reported that he had not heard from item A (Deborah Reed on Angelia Lane/Parker Drive) and that said property had not been cut. Items B, C, D, E, I, J, K (Carroll, Kimble, Gibson, Kerney, Palmer, Gulf National Life Insurance Co., Inc., and Robinson,) had all called and were in the process of cleaning said properties. Items F, G, and L (Davidson, Patel, and Ross) had been completed. Item H (Thomas at 109 Lovett Drive) needs to be videoed and proceed with condemnation proceedings. Listing of properties in question may be found on page 658 of this Minute Book W.

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Brabham directing the Mayor and Public Works Director to take the necessary steps to insure that lots/houses detailed in Agenda Items A-L are in compliance with the City Ordinance, noting that item M (Milton and Chandra Magee) is excluded from said listing since the City had not received the return receipt notice, and that items F, G, and L, are completed. Items B, C, D, E, I, J, and K that have been started on and not completed are authorized one additional week to complete. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

Public Works Director Alderman is to check on a drainage problem reported by Mrs. Joe Kimble (agenda item 8-C) where everything that washes out of the sewer runs directly into her back yard at 103 Pima Street. Public Works Director Alderman apprised the Board that the two lots in Cherry Park that Public Works was directed to cut at the last Board Meeting have been placed into the mowing schedule, and the lot owned by Leon Ghetty that had begun to be cleaned has been completed.

UPDATE ON 1994 CDBG FOR SUBSTANDARD HOUSING ON RECTANGLE STREET

CMPDD representative Mike Monk updated the Board of Aldermen on the status and requirements of the \$300,000.00 1994 Community Development Block Grant that was awarded to the City of Clinton to help eliminate eight substandard houses on Rectangle Street that are beyond rehabilitation. This grant will acquire said properties, relocate the four renters and three homeowners to standard housing, and demolish houses. The three homeowners will have homes re-built in the same area. The renters will be moved to the top of the Section 8 Certificate Voucher list by the MS Regional Housing Authority for rent subsidy for standard Section 8 rental housing in Clinton.

Mr. Monk distributed the proposed Timetable for Initiation of said project and a listing of those eight families to be helped as found on pages 659-661 of this Minute Book W, noting that the City will need to request proposals for and select a City Administrator, Attorney, Land Surveyor, Appraiser and Review Appraiser for professional services. **NO BOARD ACTION** required.

BID ACCEPTED FOR NON-GRAFFITI TRAFFIC SIGNS

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 662 of this Minute Book W that sealed bids were requested on June 2, 1994, for traffic signage materials supply, and only one bid being received as shown on page 557 of this Minute Book W, the Board requested the Clerk to hold said bid and re-advertise for non-graffiti signage materials. Proof of Publication of said re-advertisement for July 7, 1994, may be found on page 663 of this Minute Book W, with Bid Tabulation of bids received found on page 664 of this Minute Book W.

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Fisher to accept the low bid of Custom Products Corporation in the

amount of \$17,824.58. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. It was noted that the non-graffiti signs had been sampled with spray paint and cleaning and the materials do seem to work in a satisfactory manner.

BRIGHTON HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION REQUESTS TO BE INCLUDED IN CITY PLANNING OF BRIGHTON PARK

Representatives of the Brighton Homeowners Association Rodney Cummings and Tommy Cardin asked about the status of the construction of the proposed City park to be located at the old southwest lagoon behind Brighton Subdivision, and requested that representatives of the Brighton Homeowners Association be included in the planning of the park since the park will greatly impact their neighborhood. The Homeowners main objectives were that they want the lagoon drained, don't want the park project to be abandoned, and want to know how the Homeowners Association can help expedite matters. NO BOARD ACTION required.

ADVERTISING APPROVED FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Economic Development Director Jim Powell requested the Board to approve advertising promotions in the approximate amounts as follows noting that the money is in his current budget: \$7,500.00 to the Clarion Ledger for 8 weeks worth of ads in the Real Estate Section of the Sunday paper noting that Clinton is a "Livable City"; \$2,808.00 to the MS Business Journal to solicit commercial and retail business to the City; and \$5,000.00 as far as it will go to update the City of Clinton Brochure material that was last updated three years ago.

MOTION made by Alderman Touchton and SECONDED by Alderman Todd to authorize Economic Director Powell to proceed with said advertisements. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Alderman DePriest stated that he would like to see money budgeted in the future to afford on-site prospecting of businesses with our Economic Developer making personal visits recruiting businesses rather than the majority of the monies going into ads.

GUNN APPOINTED TO SCHOOL BOARD TO FILL VACANCY

MOTION made by Alderman DePriest and SECONDED by Alderman Brabham to appoint Phillip Gunn immediately to fill the unexpired term of Sonny Jones who resigned from the School Board due to job demands. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Said term expires March 1995.

ADOPTION OF THE REVISED 1993-1994 BUDGET

MOTION made by Alderman Brabham and SECONDED by Alderman Fisher to approve the revised 1993-1994 General Budget, Water and Sewer Budget and the Parks and Recreation Capital Projects Fund as found on pages 665-669 of this Minute Book W. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

AUTHORIZATION GRANTED TO INCREASE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN SCS PROJECTS

Noting that the SCS Projects of Crosskeys, Lovett/Larado, and Gloucester estimated at \$210,000.00 with the City's matching 20% share at \$42,000.00, is now inadequate since the low bid received was \$223,000.00 requiring a 20% match of \$46,800.00, City Engineer Broome requested the Board to increase the City's participation from \$42,000.00 to \$46,800.00, noting that said amount is included in the aforementioned revised 1993-1994 budget, MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Ferrell to amend the City's participation in the SCS projects as stated. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Copy of project agreement amendment #1 may be found on page 670 of this Minute Book W.

BID AUTHORIZATION FOR STREET OVERLAY DENIED

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and **SECONDED** by Alderman Touchton to authorize the Public Works Department to solicit bids for street overlay for Kentwood Subdivision and Hawthorne as shown in items 2 and 3 on page 671-672 of this Minute Book W and for Lane Street, Murial Street, the Library Parking Lot and restriping railroad crossings as shown in items 4, 5, 7, and 8 on page 672 of this Minute Book W. **ROLL CALL VOTE:** Alderman Brabham - "aye", Alderman Ferrell - "nay", Alderman DePriest - "nay", Alderman Todd - "nay", Alderman Fisher - "aye", Alderman Touchton - "aye", Alderman Lott - "nay". **MOTION FAILED 3-4.**

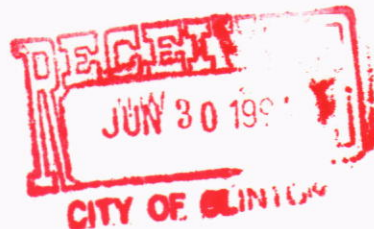

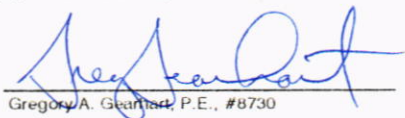
