APPROVAL OF RETIREMENT SYSTEM "CATCH UP PROGRAM" FOR LIL SANDIDGE

MOTION made by Alderman Lott and **SECONDED** by Alderman Fisher to approve the employer contribution in the amount of \$2,876.10 for the retirement "catch-up" program for Mrs. Lil Sandidge with the understanding that Mrs. Sandidge must contribute her employee portion as outlined on pages 1106-1107 of this Minute Book V. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Johnson not present for voting.

APPROVAL OF LOW BID FOR LOVETT WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY ADDITIONS AND MODIFICATIONS

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 1108 of this Minute Book V that sealed bids would be taken for modifications and additions to a partially completed wastewater treatment facility, namely Lovett, and said bids reflected on the bid tabulation sheet found on page 1109-1111 of this Minute Book V, **MOTION** made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Valente to approve the low bid of Hemphill Construction Company in the amount of \$293,630 for the Lovett Wastewater Treatment Facility additions and modifications. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Johnson not present for voting. Loan agreement approval to be placed on next agenda. Williford, Gearhart & Knight to issue notice to proceed on June 1, 1993, with the addition of a clause granting City right to withdraw notice should sufficient funds not be available.

APPROVAL GRANTED TO DAVIS TO USE CFD VEHICLE FOR BIKE TOUR

Acting upon the request as found on page 1112 of this Minute Book V from Clinton Fire Department Reserve Officer John Davis to use a CFD automobile from May 22-23, 1993, to assist the National Multiple Sclerosis Society Bike Tour from Clinton to McComb via the Natchez Trace Parkway, MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Todd to approve said use of the Fire Department automobile. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

AUTHORIZATION TO PURCHASE NARCOTIC DETECTION DOG

Upon request of Police Chief Byington to purchase one narcotic detection German Shepherd Dog in the amount of \$4,800.00 which includes 80 hours of handler training noting that said dog will be boarded at a kennel on Highway 18, and that Messrs. Maurice King and Mac Robinson have agreed to donate the cost of the dog to the CPD, MOTION made by Alderman Todd and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to approve said purchase request. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

BOARD AUTHORIZATION TO MAKE SETTLEMENT OFFER FOR LOVETT LAGOON ACREAGE

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and SECONDED by Alderman Valente directing Mayor Smith and City Attorney Spell to make a formal offer of \$2,500.00 per acre to the owners of the required six acres of property needed for the Lovett Lagoon Wastewater Treatment Facility site. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

AGENDA ITEMS #11 AND 12 POSTPONED

Upon request, agenda items #11 and 12, automated door for Fire Station #2 and a forced main on Pinehaven Drive were postponed until a later date to gather more information. NO BOARD ACTION.

ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN SLOT APPROVED FOR ADDITION TO CLASSIFICATION SCHEDULE

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to accept the proposal of the Public Works Director to establish the new position of Engineering Technician for the Public Works Department. ROLL CALL VOTE: Alderman Ferrell - "nay", Alderman Valente "nay", Alderman Todd - "nay", Alderman Fisher - "aye", Alderman Johnson - "aye", Alderman Lott - "aye". MOTION BEING TIED 3-3, Mayor Smith cast the tie-breaking "aye" vote with MOTION CARRYING 4-3 to establish said new position. Said position shall be added to the City of Clinton Pay Classification Schedule as GS 12 with the job description as found on pages 1113-1114 of this Minute Book V, with beginning date July, 1993.

LAGOON BETWEEN PATTON AND KELLY DRIVE

Noting that lagoon property between Patton and Kelly Drive that the City of Clinton acquired by lease-purchase agreement still not having been reclaimed to date, Alderman Ferrell requested Public Works Director Alderman and City Engineer Broome to contact DEQ to meet at said lagoon site and make their recommendations for reclamation of said area. City Engineer Broome to see if there are some less stringent procedures that may be followed since this lagoon has long been abandoned. Further, Public Works Director Alderman to look at said site May 19, 1993, to determine if he can at least bushhog said property and take the necessary steps to start reclaiming said property, and to notify the Mayor and Board of Aldermen when DEQ can meet at said site so that Aldermen may attend said meeting.

repairs requested to be done at the April 6, 1993 Board Meeting (plumbing and installation of restroom doors) at Robinson Park NO BOARD ACTION was taken.

PUBLIC HEARING - WICKSTEAD ROAD SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 1115 of this Minute Book V that a public hearing would be held for the purpose of hearing any objections to a Special Improvement District proposed to be constructed in the Wickstead Road Project, Mayor Smith opened said hearing at 6:15 p.m., called for public objections and received none.

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Valente authorizing the City to borrow \$57,800.00 for construction of the proposed sewer project on Wickstead Road. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Valente to accept the low bid of Jay Bearden Construction Company in the amount of \$52,794.00 as shown on the Bid Tabulation Sheet found on page 1116 of this Minute Book V. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION made by Alderman Fisher and SECONDED by Alderman Valente to assess the construction cost of properties benefitted by parcel in the total amount of \$44,661.00, noting that the City previously approved to pay \$8,133.00 of said cost as shown on pages 636 and 650 of this Minute Book V. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

No further comments being made, Mayor Smith closed said public hearing at 6:33 p.m.

Subject: Use of Fire Department vehicle

For the past three years I have volunteered my time to provide first aid and communications (via Amateur Radio) for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, Mississippi Chapter's MS 150 bike tour. This bike tour is an annual event to raise money to help persons with multiple sclerosis, the most prevalent disease of the central nervous system. This years tour we are expecting over 300 bicyclist to ride from Clinton to McComb via the Natches Trace Parkway.

During previous tours I have used my personnel vehicle which has worked well, but I have observed a need to have a more visible and official appearing vehicle to increase awareness to other motorists. Vehicles and personnel from Mississippi Highway Patrol, Harrison County Sheriff Office, Gulfport Police Department and National Park Service have assisted with traffic control and safety throughout the tour. All support personnel are volunteers, with the Society providing food, lodging, and fuel during the tour. The Society also has a million dollar liability insurance policy covering volunteers and bike riders.

This years bike tour is May 22, 23 and I am requesting the use of a fire department vehicle during those two days to promote safety and good public relations for City of Clinton and the Clinton Fire Department.

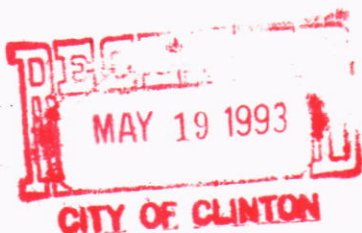
