Quotes listed in items L and Z are on file in the Office of the City Clerk. The police vehicles listed in Item J are the same surplus vehicles shown in the June 1, 1993, minutes where bids received in the amounts of \$1,000.00 and \$800.00 from Mr. Reginald Harris were rejected and authorized to be re-advertised. Upon a phone poll of all aldermen it was agreed to accept the \$3,000.00 offered from Capital Services Corporation rather than re-advertise for the sale of said vehicles. Said bids received on May 24, 1993, are on file in the Office of the City Clerk with Proof of Publication found on page 1170 of this Minute Book V. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

PUBLIC HEARING FOR SMALL CITIES CDBG FOR HOUSING IMPROVEMENTS

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 1171 of this Minute Book V that a public hearing would be held before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the purpose of obtaining citizen input into the development of an application to the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development for a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant up to \$650,000.00 to assist low income renters and owners in the Rectangle Street area with housing improvements, Mayor Smith declared said public hearing open at 5:03 p.m. Mr. Bruce Reynolds, Central Mississippi Planning and Development District, stated that this was the first of two required public hearings, and that he was leaving three policy documents that would have to be approved by the Board of Aldermen if the project is funded with the City Attorney to review ahead of time. VARIANCE REQUESTS FOR CHECKERS DRIVE-IN RESTAURANT HEARD BY BOARD

As shown by Proof of Publication found on page 1173 of this Minute Book V proper public hearing was held before the City of Clinton Planning and Zoning Board on June 8, 1993, for the purpose of determining whether or not to grant that three-fold dimensional variance request by Checkers Drive-in Restaurant, Inc., for a curb-cut onto Prospect Street; to require five less parking spaces on site; and authorization to erect two ground signs rather than one as called for in the Planning and Zoning Ordinance.

The Planning and Zoning Board having recommended denial of the curb-cut request and the additional ground sign, and having recommended granting the request for five less parking spaces, Mr. George Harris of Checkers Restaurant, presented revised grading and ingress/egress plans to the Department of Public Works which cleared the visibility/safety problem which concerned the Planning and Zoning Board, and appealed this matter to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

Upon the recommendation of the Public Works Director, MOTION made by Alderman Johnson and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to concur with Mr. Harris' request and grant the curb-cut onto Prospect Street as shown in Mr. Harris' revised grading plan. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. MOTION made by Alderman Lott and SECONDED by Alderman Todd to grant the parking space variance as requested for five less parking spaces. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Todd to accept the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission and deny the variance request for an additional ground sign. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

DIMENSIONAL VARIANCE REQUEST FOR CHAMBERS AT 211 LINDALE DENIED

As shown by Proof of Publication found on Page 1174 of this Minute Book V that proper public hearing was held before the City of Clinton Planning and Zoning Board for the purpose of determining whether or not a dimensional variance request would be granted to Becky and Alan Chambers for the purpose of adding a room onto their home at 211 Lindale Street, MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Ryan to affirm the recommendation of the City of Clinton Planning and Zoning Board that said dimensional variance request not be granted. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

RE-ZONING REQUEST FROM R-1 TO C-1 FOR MURRIEL ON TINNIN ROAD AT KELLY DRIVE DENIED

As shown by Proof of Publication found on Page 1175 of this Minute Book V that proper public hearing was held before the Planning and Zoning Board for the purpose of determining whether or not to grant that re-zoning request of Virgil Murriel to re-zone property on Tinnin Road at Kelly Drive from R-1 to C-1 for the purpose of erecting a beauty shop, MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and SECONDED by Alderman Ryan to grant said rezoning request. Prior to a vote being taken it was noted that the Land Use and Thoroughfares Plan recommends said area to be zoned R-1 and that even though there had been no opposition from neighbors to said rezoning, that said area did not show significant change as required by the Zoning Ordinance to warrant said re-zoning. ROLL CALL VOTE: Alderman Lott - "nay", Alderman Johnson - "nay", Alderman Todd - "nay", Alderman Valente - "nay", Alderman Ferrell - "aye", Alderman Ryan - "aye". MOTION FAILED 2-4.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT FOR LAND FOR LOVETT WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY

MOTION made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Todd to adopt that Resolution found on pages 1192-1193 of this Minute Book V authorizing payment in the amount of \$15,095.00 to the Vadhwa Partnership for those five property owners as listed in said Resolution for the required 6.038 acres of land necessary for the construction of the Lovett Wastewater Treatment Facility. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

BOARD ENDORSES RECOMMENDATION TO NEW ADMINISTRATION TO CONSIDER PURCHASE OF PRICE PROPERTY AND OPTION FOR PALMER PROPERTY FOR PARKS

The Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee having recommended to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen to as soon as possible begin purchase of the Price Property as a central comprehensive park and also obtain option for no longer than six months (until the City of Clinton sees what will happen with the proposed sports complex and golf course at the Waterways Experiment Station now under study by a task force) for 10-15 acres of the Palmer property for ballfields to service the citizens south of I-20, and acting upon the request of Mayor Smith to refer this recommendation to the new administration for their consideration with this current Board of Aldermen's endorsement, **MOTION** made by Alderman Valente and **SECONDED** by Alderman Ferrell to make said recommendation to the new Administration. **ROLL CALL VOTE:** Alderman Ryan - "aye", Alderman Ferrell - "aye", Alderman Valente - "aye", Alderman Todd - "nay", Alderman Johnson - "aye", Alderman Lott - "aye". **MOTION CARRIED 5-1.**

CITY TO ACQUIRE EASEMENTS FOR BRIARS TREATMENT FACILITY

Upon the request of Public Works Director Alderman for the City to make an offer to property owners J. E. Carter and Lloyd Burton based upon appraisals found on pages 1194-1197 of this Minute Book V as submitted by Jim Terry on June 14, 1993, for easements necessary to relocate the Briars Treatment Facility, **MOTION** made by Alderman Valente and **SECONDED** by Alderman Todd to so move authorization. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

MAYOR TO EXECUTE CONTRACT WITH HEMPHILL CONSTRUCTION COMPANY FOR LOVETT LAGOON

Upon request of Public Works Director Alderman to authorize the Mayor to execute that contract between Hemphill Construction Company and the City of Clinton for the construction of the Lovett Lagoon, **MOTION** made by Alderman Ferrell and **SECONDED** by Alderman Lott to approve said request. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** Public Works Director stated that said contract was previously accepted by the Board in the amount of \$293,630.00 as shown on page 1101 of this Minute Book V, and that a pre-construction conference has been set for June 16, 1993.

CITY TO INSTALL DUPLEX WASTEWATER PUMP FOR LAUREN LANE

Upon the request of Public Works Director Alderman to install a duplex wastewater pump to serve the residents of 104 and 106 Lauren Lane, Cotton Acres Sewer Improvements Phase II, at an approximate cost to the City of \$7,500.00 plus operation and maintenance, **MOTION** made by Alderman Valente and **SECONDED** by Alderman Todd to approve the installation of said duplex wastewater pump. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**
