CORRECTION OF DRAINAGE PROBLEM ON NORTH SIDE OF CLINTON BLVD. BETWEEN LINDALE AND MORRISON HEIGHTS DELAYED FOR FURTHER CHECK ON RIGHT-OF-WAY

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE REPORT OF THE ELECTION COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI, CERTIFYING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL BOND ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1990, CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SAID CITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,550,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A SPRINGRIDGE ROAD EXTENSION; AND THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$850,000) TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING PARKS WITHIN THE CITY

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the City of Clinton, Mississippi (the "City"), acting for and on behalf of the City does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. That pursuant to a resolution entitled, "A Resolution declaring the intention of the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, to issue general obligation bonds of said municipality in the maximum principal amount of Three Million Five Hundred Fifty Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$3,550,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of paying the costs of widening and extending Springridge Road and New Prospect Street to provide a north/south road for the City of Clinton, performing related construction and work to effectuate the project, and paying the cost of such borrowing, at a total project cost estimated to be approximately equal to the maximum principal amount of the bonds authorized herein; adjudicating no funds are available to the City of Clinton, Mississippi for such purposes; and providing for the calling and holding of an election thereon," (the "Street Bond Resolution"), adopted by the Board on September 11, 1990, a special election was called for Tuesday, November 6, 1990, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City the proposition stated in the Street Bond Resolution (the "Street Bond Proposition"); and

2. That pursuant to a resolution entitled, "A Resolution declaring the intention of the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, to issue general obligation bonds of said municipality in the maximum principal amount of Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand and no/100 dollars (\$850,000.00) to raise money for the purpose of paying the costs of purchasing, constructing, improving and equipping various parks within the City of Clinton, performing related construction and work to effectuate the project, and paying

the cost of such borrowing, at a total project cost estimated to be approximately equal to the maximum principal amount of the bonds authorized herein; adjudicating no funds are available to the City of Clinton, Mississippi for such purposes; and providing for the calling and holding of an election thereon," (the "Parks Bond Resolution"), adopted by the Board on September 11, 1990, a special election was called for Tuesday, November 6, 1990, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City the proposition stated in the Parks Bond Resolution (the "Parks Bond Proposition"); and

3. That a notice of said elections was published once each week for at least three consecutive weeks in The Clinton News, newspaper published and having general circulation in the City and in The Clarion Ledger, a newspaper having a general circulation in the City, both newspapers being qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, the first publication of which was made not less than twenty-one days prior to the date fixed for such election and the last publication of which was made not more than seven days prior to the date of said election, said notice having been published on October 11, 18, 25, and November 1, 1990, all as shown by the publisher's affidavit presented and filed with the Secretary of the Board; and

4. That notice of said elections was given in the manner and for the time required by law and in substantially the form prescribed by the Board in the Street Bond Resolution and in the Parks Bond Resolution; and

5. That pursuant to the Street Bond and the Parks Bond Resolutions and the notice of said elections, special elections were held within the City on Tuesday, November 6, 1990, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors the Street Bond Proposition and the Parks Bond Proposition, with each Proposition to be voted on separately.

6. That the City Election Commissioners filed a report stating the results of the special elections with the Board, which reports are attached to this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton as follows:

SECTION 1. That the report of the Election Commissioners attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, concerning the results of the special bond elections are hereby accepted and approved and ordered spread upon the minutes.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and adjudicated that less than three fifths (3/5) of the qualified electors who voted on the Street Bond Proposition voted in favor of the Proposition, all as shown by the attached report of the Election Commissioners.

SECTION 3. Since the Street Bond Issue did not obtain the necessary voter approval, the Board shall not issue its general obligation bonds in the amounts and for the purposes stated in the Street Bond Resolution.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found, determined and adjudicated that at least three fifths (3/5) of the qualified electors who voted on the Parks Bond Proposition did vote in favor of the Proposition, as shown by the attached report of the Election Commissioners.

SECTION 5. The Board is now authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City in the amount and for the purposes stated in the Parks Bond Resolution.

SECTION 6. The general obligation parks improvement bonds shall be offered for sale and issued in accordance with further orders and resolutions of the Board.

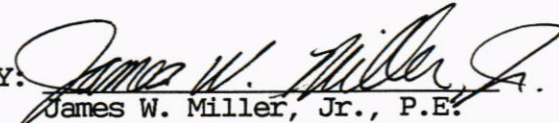
