AUTHORIZATION GRANTED TO MAYOR TO ENTER AGREEMENT WITH JAMES POWELL ON CONSULTANT BASIS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPER POSITION

MOTION made by Alderman Chappell and SECONDED by Alderman Lott authorizing Mayor Smith to enter into agreement on behalf of the City with James Powell for the Economic Developer position. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Copy of said agreement may be found on Pages 379-380 of this Minute Book U.

CITY ATTORNEY DIRECTED TO DRAW UP SUITABLE AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF CLINTON AND HINDS COUNTY FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE

Upon Mayor Smith's request, MOTION made by Alderman Montgomery and SECONDED by Alderman Valente directing City Attorney Spell to draw up an agreement between the City of Clinton and Hinds County for ambulance service compatible with the agreement between Hinds County and Mobile Medic. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Said agreement to be brought back to the next Board Meeting.

AUTHORIZATION GRANTED TO PURCHASE FOUR NEW POLICE VEHICLES AT STATE CONTRACT PRICE

Upon Police Chief Byington's request, MOTION made by Alderman Montgomery and SECONDED by Alderman Ferrell granting authorization to purchase four new Chevrolet Caprice vehicles from Herrin-Gear Chevrolet, Jackson, Mississippi, at the State Contract Price of \$12,435.21 each totaling \$49,740.84. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

HICKORY LANE DRAINAGE PROBLEM ADDRESSED

MOTION made by Alderman Ryan and SECONDED by Alderman Chappell to accept a drainage easement and furnish funds if the Public Works does not have enough funds in their Budget to put a clean-out plug on the property of 105-107 Hickory Lane in order to get the roots out, remove the 3 trees, put in a 15" tee and a manhole plate at an estimated cost of less than \$500.00.

Prior to a vote being taken, MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Chappell to amend the motion to include "not to exceed \$500.00 and if in fact said project turns out to be more than \$500.00 then the proper plans for remedying said situation if the easements do exist will be brought back to this Board before work is actually done." AMENDMENT TO THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION-AS-AMENDED CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY to accept the easement, clean out the culvert, put in the tee, remove 3 trees and get the roots out of the line not to exceed \$500.00 and if cost does exceed said \$500.00 proper plans for remedying said situation shall be brought back to Board prior to work actually being done.

EMINENT DOMAIN PROCEDURES STOPPED FOR SOUTHWEST LAGOON & AUTHORIZATION

GRANTED TO UPGRADE SAID LAGOON AT PRESENT LOCATION

MOTION made by Alderman Ryan and SECONDED by Alderman Chappell to stop the eminent domain procedures for that property to re-locate the Southwest lagoon and to proceed with upgrading said lagoon at its present location with sandfilters to meet the EPA standards. ROLL CALL VOTE: Alderman Ryan - "aye", Alderman Ferrell - "nay", Alderman Valente - "nay", Alderman Chappell - "aye", Alderman Montgomery - "aye", Alderman Lott - "aye". MOTION CARRIED 4-2. Mr. Sidney Spiro, 100 Carrie Drive, asked that the record reflect that he contested Alderman Valente's vote as a conflict of interest.

MAYOR SMITH TO ARRANGE AN ADDITIONAL MEETING WITH BFI REGARDING RECYCLING

Mayor Smith informed the Board that he would arrange an additional working meeting with BFI representatives to further discuss City-wide recycling plans. NO BOARD ACTION taken.

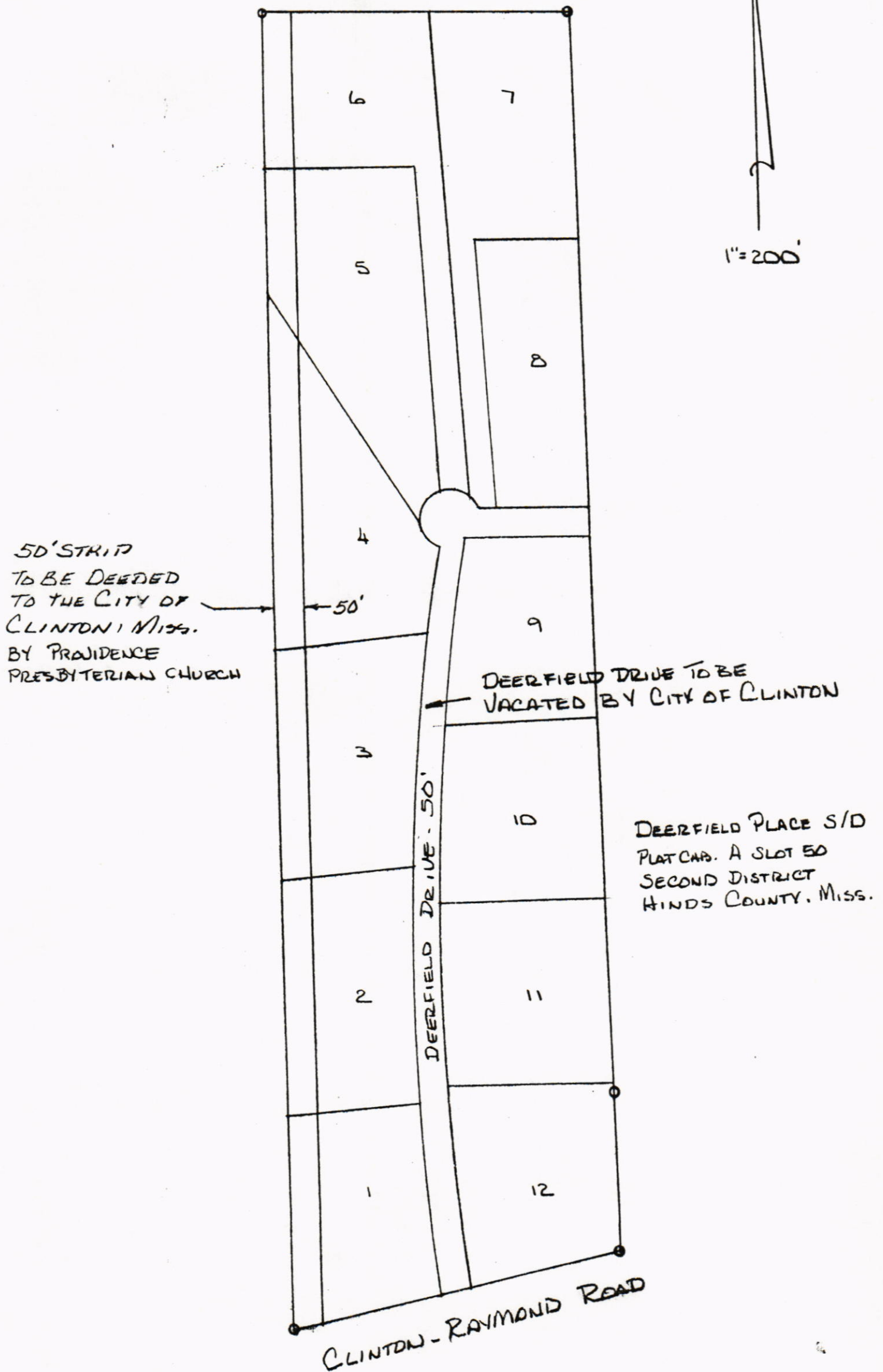

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Clinton has embarked upon a program of economic development that includes expanding the economic and tax base of the City, including advertising the economic opportunities available within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that James G. Powell is a person of extensive and valuable experience in this field; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to obtain the advice, assistance and expertise of James G. Powell in advertising and developing the economic opportunities within the City; and

WHEREAS, James G. Powell is willing to provide such services to the City;

IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED as follows:

1. James G. Powell will provide to the City of Clinton advice and assistance in economic and community development, including advertising economic opportunities, and will provide a physical presence in the City or elsewhere, as agreed, in activities on the City's behalf, that time to be equivalent to sixteen (16) hours per week, as determined by mutual agreement of James G. Powell and the Mayor of the City of Clinton.

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the services performed by James G. Powell, the City will pay to James G. Powell the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) per month, payable monthly.

2. The services performed by James G. Powell will be that of an independant consultant and contractor, and he shall not be an employee of the City of Clinton.

3. The City of Clinton shall provide to James G. Powell suitable office accommodations for his work in Clinton and, when called upon to travel outside the City or to perform tasks that involve expenses not contemplated by the expenses paid under this Agreement, the City shall pay such expenses, as are authorized by

law; provided, however, no expenses for which reimbursement shall be sought shall be incurred by James G. Powell unless same has been approved by the City of Clinton prior to the expense being incurred.

This Agreement may be terminated by sixty (60) days written notice by either party to the other.

THIS AGREEMENT entered into on this the 3RD day of JANUARY, 1991.
