Following further discussion of Consent Agenda Item M, MOTION made by Alderman Lott and SECONDED by Alderman Johnson to approve the Joe Williams Electric Supply Company bill in the amount of \$1,039.15 as listed in Consent Agenda Item M above. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MCCART TO SECURE BFI CONTAINER AND SITE FOR RECYCLING PILOT PROGRAM AND VALENTE, FERRELL AND RYAN TO SERVE ON COMMITTEE TO REVIEW KEEP AMERICA BEAUTIFUL APPLICATION

Following a presentation made by Charlotte McCart, Clinton Chamber of Commerce Community Appearance Committee, in which she apprised the Board that April is "Keep America Beautiful" Month with Saturday April 21, 1990, being Clinton Clean-up Day; and Sunday, April 22, 1990, being Earth Day, she then requested in conjunction with the Clean-up/Earth Day emphasis approval to launch a pilot program with BFI for recyclables wherein one multi-collection center would be established for glass, plastic and aluminum containers, noting that BFI will furnish said container as a pilot project on behalf of the Chamber Appearance Committee at no cost to the City, MOTION made by Alderman Montgomery and SECONDED by Alderman Ryan for Charlotte McCart to pursue securing container from BFI and having said container placed on an appropriate site agreeable to the property owner, Mayor Smith, Chamber President Anderson and Public Works Director Alderman. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Mrs. McCart then apprised the Board of the Chamber's desire to apply for Keep America Beautiful Certification and requested the Board's

verbal approval and monetary endorsement to help with the required one-time fee of \$2,000.00. The Board feeling that they needed to be more aware of specifics pertaining to said application, Mrs. McCart then requested a representative or a sub-committee of the Board of Aldermen be appointed to work with the Chamber Committee to review the required application. Aldermen Valente, Ferrell and Ryan were appointed to said sub-committee.

PRELIMINARY PLAT OF GREENWOOD SUBDIVISION PART 1 POSTPONED

Upon request of City Attorney Spell, discussion and/or approval of the preliminary plat of Greenwood Subdivision Part 1 was postponed until the next Board Meeting. NO BOARD ACTION taken.

ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING OF TRUCK AND TRACTOR TRAILER VEHICLES ON HIGHWAY 80 RIGHT-OF-WAY INSIDE THE CITY OF CLINTON

MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Chappell to adopt that Ordinance prohibiting parking of truck and tractor trailer vehicles on the north and south sides of Highway 80 right-of-way inside the City of Clinton. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. ACTION POSTPONED ON ABANDONED HOUSES ON LAKEVIEW AND SPROLES STREETS

Noting that the house at 101 Sproles Street has been torn down but the lot is yet to be cleaned up and that the house at 221 West Lakeview Drive has been somewhat secured and that there is still a few days left until the 30-day grace period granted is up, said items were postponed until the next Board meeting. NO BOARD ACTION taken.

CITY TO PARTICIPATE IN COST OF WEINSTEIN COMMUNITY STUDY

MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Johnson to co-sponsor the Weinstein Community Study with the Clinton Chamber of Commerce in the amount of \$3,750.00 from the City with remaining \$3,750.00 cost of study plus travel and all related expenses to be paid by the Clinton Chamber of Commerce with said City's portion to be placed on the next Budget Amendment process. ROLL CALL VOTE: Alderman Ryan - "aye", Alderman Ferrell - "nay", Alderman Valente - "aye", Alderman Chappell - "aye", Alderman Montgomery - "aye", Alderman Johnson - "aye", Alderman Lott - "aye". COPY OF LAND USE AND THOROUGHFARES MAP ORDERED FOR CHAMBER OFFICE

MOTION made by Alderman Valente and SECONDED by Alderman Lott to accept the proposal to order an exact copy of the Clinton Land Use and Thoroughfares Map from CMPDD to be located in the Office of the Clinton Chamber of Commerce. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. Said map cost to be \$800.00 and was recommended by the Clinton Planning & Zoning Commission.

INTERVIEWS SET FOR APRIL 24, 1990 WITH ARCHITECTS INTERESTED IN DESIGNING NEW POLICE/COURTROOM FACILITIES

Following a brief discussion, it was decided to set April 24, 1990, from 8 to 10 A.M., as an interview time with architects interested in designing the new police/courtroom facilities. Said interviews will be held separately in 15 minute increments in the Chamber Board Room, allowing each architect an opportunity to present his qualifications, experience, job referrals and a brief question/answer period. It was noted that 6 architect firms have at the present time expressed an interest in designing

the police/court facility. NO BOARD ACTION.

CITY ENGINEER TO SECURE CURRENT ESTIMATES ON COST TO REPAIR/PRESERVE BRICKS ON MONROE STREET

Following Alderman Johnson's request for attention to needed street repair on Monroe, City Engineer Anderson apprised the Board that these bricks are severely deteriorated and it would cost approximately \$5,500 - \$6,000.00 to overlay that portion of Monroe from College to E. Leake and that the last estimate he had to re-brick which would include taking the bricks up, re-working whatever is under the dirt or sand bed, laying 6" asphalt base course and re-bricking would be in the neighborhood of \$54,000.00. Anderson further stated that when he began serving on the Brick Streets Revitalization Committee his goal in mind was to request Civic Clubs to adopt a block and rework a block at a time. It was suggested that it might be possible to conduct an "Adopt-A-Brick" Program to raise enough money to preserve said bricks, noting that said bricks have been in place since 1923. Anderson also informed the Board that it is possible to get a brick that looks like brick but is structurally concrete for approximately \$2.50 per square foot. Anderson was requested to look into further estimates on repairing bricks before asphaltting. NO BOARD ACTION.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING OF TRUCK AND TRACTOR TRAILER
VEHICLES ON HIGHWAY 80 RIGHT-OF-WAY INSIDE THE
CITY OF CLINTON, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, United States Highway 80 is a primary east-west thoroughfare through the City of Clinton, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, Highway 80 is crossed by several north-south City streets; and

WHEREAS, traffic within the City on Highway 80 is of high density, making Highway 80 one of the most traveled thoroughfares in the City; and

WHEREAS, truck and tractor trailer vehicles parked on and alongside Highway 80 within the City limits obstruct the vision of motorists traveling both north-south and east-west; and

WHEREAS, this obstruction of vision by truck and semi-trailer vehicles creates a hazard to motorists;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Clinton, Mississippi, as follows:

It shall be unlawful to park a truck or tractor trailer vehicle on the right-of-way of Highway 80 within the City limits of Clinton, Mississippi, except for emergency purposes.

Any person found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) and sentenced to serve not more than six (6) months in jail.

This Ordinance having been first reduced to writing was then considered by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as a whole and then section by section. Alderman Valente moved adoption and the motion was seconded by Alderman Chappell. The vote was as follows:
